Embracing the Challenge - Using the Written Word to Improve Student Performance

When learning a foreign language, quite understandably the emphasis is usually on the skill of speaking. We generally ask, 'Can you speak English?', rather than 'Can you read (or write) English?' And while students tend to prefer speaking rather than reading (and writing even less!) it is impossible to segregate the skills when teaching. In this session, Alice will be looking at different ways of how to use the written word (both of the students and of other writers) to review language, evaluate language, build on language and improve the student's own spoken and written language, without the written word feeling like a chore. There will be a variety of practical classroom ideas, which can be adapted for different levels and keep the dynamics going in the classroom!

Alice Osman is the Chief Examiner of Anglia Examinations based at Chichester College, England. She is an experienced EL teacher, Director of Studies and Advanced Practitioner. Before this she worked in Greece, the US and the UK as an EL teacher, Director of Studies and Advanced Practitioner for 18 years.
