

In this talk, Bea G^a Carvajal will delve into the role of the teacher in the English classroom when, as is most often the case, we have students who are commonly described as disruptive—those who give us trouble. ADHD students feel like the fish that is judged on its ability to climb a tree. And we all agree that that is unfair. But do we know what to do? Writing can be a challenge to both learners and teachers of English. In terms of what we do in class, it's generally the least practiced of the skills but it doesn't and, ideally, shouldn't need to be this way.






